Written Question on Notice

Senator Adams asked:

How much has been spent on the Medicare Chronic Disease Dental Programme and how has it been distributed by area (ASGC-RA) and type of procedure (eg complex restoration of emergency care and what is the total amount spent so fare in the NT (as an example of how well the programme is reaching regional and remote areas?

Answer:

From 1 November 2007 to 31 January 2011 the Commonwealth has provided a total of \$1,431,884,158 in benefits under the Chronic Disease Dental Scheme.

Distribution of benefits paid by remoteness area (ASGC-RA) is as follows:

NB this table shows the distribution of benefits by the area (ASGC-RA category) where the dental care service occurred, ie the location of the dentist or dental care provider. Data on benefits by ASGC-RA categories based on patient address are not available.
