Senator Fierravanti-Wells asked:

What are the total number of people seen against each Better Access Medicare Items in each year since 1 November 2006?

## Answer:

While the Better Access evaluation did not report on the number of people seen against each of the Medicare <u>items</u> available under the Better Access initiative, it did report on the number of persons who received services by item group. This data is summarised in Table 1 below.
