Senator Brown asked:

Recent speculation suggests that the Government is considering requiring drug testing for all welfare recipients. Can the Department explain how this might work?

- a) Is the department aware of the number of welfare recipients that have been tested, and the number that have recorded a positive test result?
- b) What is the cost associated with administering these drug tests in New Zealand?
- c) Does the Department consider that the costs associated with administering these tests is worthwhile, considering the number of people that have returned a positive result?
- d) Has any evaluation been done on the New Zealand experience? What were the stated aims of the policy in New Zealand, and have they met those aims?
