Funding breakdown of Carers Australia's operational and program funding – both in 2016-17 and over the forward estimates.

Answer:

Department of Social Security grant agreements do not usually differentiate between operational and program funding. For payments to Carers Australia:

- Carers Peak Body funding is operational;
- Young Carer Bursary Program funding is separated into operational and program; and
- Financial years 2018-19 and 2019-20 are still being finalised.
