Page 2 of the report specifically nominates gender inequality as a cause of family violence: "...[that] some men are more likely to use violence than other men. Men who do not adhere to patriarchal and hostile gender norms are less likely than other men to use physical or sexual violence against an intimate partner... violence-supportive attitudes are shaped by attitudes towards gender and sexuality."
