**Topic:** NDIS Support packages

**Hansard Page:** Spoken **Senator Siewert,** asked:

**Senator Siewert:** The number of people who are in PHaMs and who are actually applying to

get a support package through NDIS?

**Senator SIEWERT**: I understand that. That is the best we can do. I want to see if the anecdotal evidence that we have heard is correct, which is that a small proportion of the people who have been accessing PHaMs are applying. I want to know if there is some validity in that point because that then points to what sized outside supports may be needed. When do you think you can make that information available?

**Ms Gunn**: It needs to be extracted from the data warehouse, so it will be a couple of days.

#### **Answer:**

The National Disability Insurance Agency (NDIA) was advised by the Department of Social Services to expect approximately 800 PHaMs clients to transition into the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) during 2016-17. As at 31 March 2017, 748 (or 93 per cent) had made an access request and 281 (35 per cent) had an approved plan.

It is likely that there are some NDIS participants that, due to data limitations, the NDIA cannot identify as previously having been PHaMs clients.
