- 5. The Minister for Human Services has written to the Committee to claim public interest immunity for the redacted material in the Red Book. The Minister has not given any other instructions.
- 6. No, a draft document was prepared but the document was not finalised.
- 7. Yes. The Department is providing the Committee a redacted copy of the draft brief (the 'Blue Book'). The redacted material would be exempt from release under the *Freedom of Information Act 1982*. The Minister for Human Services has written to the Committee to claim public interest immunity for the redacted material. It is important to note that the draft Blue Book was not finalised and therefore it does not necessarily reflect the views of the Department of Human Services on the matters covered by the document.
