#### **Question:**

Provide a breakdown by the main reasons for Centrelink debts and percentage of customers involved: (for example, undeclared income, under-declared income, assets, member of a couple, compensation, etc).

#### **Answer:**

While the department does report on the numbers of customers with debts, this information cannot currently be broken down to the reason for the debt. Current information on the reasons for debts is only captured by the number of debts, rather than the number of customers. Therefore a breakdown of the percentage of customers cannot be provided at this time.

The following table shows the 13 main reasons for Centrelink debts raised for recovery action in 2013-14.
