### **Question:**

I understand that there were applications for new funding for national palliative care projects and they closed on 6 August. What is the assessment criteria for funding for these projects? Are you able to give the committee a copy of those assessment criteria.

### **Answer:**

As per the Invitation to Apply documentation, applicants were required to address the following three (3) assessment criteria:

# Assessment Criterion 1: Achieving Government Policy

- 1. What are the key activities your organisation will undertake to meet the objectives of the National Palliative Care Projects?
- 2. How do the benefits of your activity align with the goals of the National Palliative Care Strategy 2010 'Supporting Australians to Live Well at the End of Life'?
- 3. Explain how the activity will be delivered nationally.
- 4. Explain how the activity will assist and enhance palliative care service delivery.

# Assessment Criterion 2: Efficient and Effective Use of Grant Funding

- 1. Describe how your organisation will work with other existing organisations to maximise the outcomes of this activity.
- 2. Provide details of any existing or proposed 'palliative care' work linkages with other organisations.
- 3. Summarise how your organisation will measure how it is achieving the outcomes (as specified by the applicant).

# Assessment Criterion 3: Governance and Performance

- 1. Provide details of the staffing requirements needed to meet the proposed work commitments.
- 2. Provide details of your organisation's governance, management structure and available facilities in place to deliver the national activity.
- 3. List your experience in delivering a similar national palliative care activity, including details of existing complementary services provided by the organisation.
