## **Question:**

Was the TGA aware of problems with PIP breast implants and Medical Vision Australia, including allegations of fraud, since 2008 as reported by Dr Fleming? If so, why was this information withheld from the 2012 Senate Inquiry?

#### **Answer:**

The TGA is not aware of any allegation of fraud by the Australian sponsor, Medical Vision Australia, relating to Poly Implant Prothese (PIP) breast implants. The Therapeutic Goods Administration first became aware that unauthorised gel was being used by the French manufacturer, Poly Implant Prosthese, in a report from the then French regulatory agency dated 31 March 2010. The PIP breast implants were formally recalled in Australia on 6 April 2010 and they were cancelled from the Australian Register of Therapeutic Goods shortly after.
