### **Ouestion:**

I understand sports drinks are high in sugar, salt and kilojoules. A regular 600 mL bottle of Gatorade contains 36 g of sugar while a standard can of coke, at 375 mL, contains 40 g of sugar.

- a) How does FSANZ respond to claims by consumer groups like CHOICE that assert these claims will ultimately mislead consumers into believing these drinks are a healthy option when they are high in sugar?
- b) What scientific evidence would be required to substantiate these claims?

### **Answer:**

- a) Food Standards Australia New Zealand (FSANZ) has received a written submission on Proposal 1030 from CHOICE, as well as submissions from a number of other consumer and public health groups. FSANZ will consider each of these submissions and any evidence provided in support of the views expressed in them.
