### **Question:**

- a) With reference to Social Security Prosecutions and people receiving social security payments, in 2014-15:
  - 1) How many people did the Department of Human Services refer to the Commonwealth Department of Public Prosecutions (CDPP)?
  - 2) How many were convicted?
  - 3) Of those convicted:
    - i) provide a breakdown by gender;
    - ii) provide a breakdown by payment type;
    - iii) provide a breakdown by age;
    - iv) provide a breakdown by state and territory of those prosecuted;
    - v) What was the total amount of funds for those who were convicted by the CDPP?
    - vi) What was the average amount involved?
- b) For 2014-15, what is the percentage of those convicted for social security fraud of the total number of income support recipients over the period (in number and percent)?
