In 2014, the geographic distribution of Extended Medicare Safety Net benefits was as follows:

** Each value represents the EMSN as a percentage of the MBS benefits paid in that remoteness area. For example, EMSN benefits were 2.4 per cent of the MBS benefits expenditure in Major Cities of Australia in 2014.
