- 1. How many pieces of correspondence had to be returned from the Minister's office and prepared for a new signature following the change of Minister?
- a. What was the time taken between correspondence being returned and new ones resent?
- 2. How many briefs had to be returned from the Minister's office and prepared for the new Minister?
- a. How many were returned and had to be shelved or completely redrafted?
- b. What was the time taken between briefs being returned and new ones resent?
- 3. What were the main changes that had to be made for correspondence and for briefs? Font and style change? Signature block? Additional background information?
- 4. Did the department provide overarching departmental briefings?
- a. And this has happened each time there is a new Minister?

Answer:

- 1. As with any change of Minister, all outstanding correspondence is reviewed, and where appropriate, redrafted for the new Minister's signature.
- 1a. The Department aims to redraft correspondence within 10 business days, however this may vary depending on the complexity of the response.
