Senator Rachel Siewert asked:

In 2014-15 (or the most recent available data), for the top 10 most prevalent disabilities (eg. physical, intellectual, psychiatric), provide details on the numbers of participants and the proportions who found 12 and 26 week outcomes (number and percentages).

Answer:

In 2014/15, approximately 16.9 per cent and 13.2 per cent of the 232,568 eligible DES participants achieved a 13 week and 26 week outcome respectively. The table below shows the break down for the most prevalent disabilities.

For the period from 1 July 2015 to 31 October 2015, approximately 6.9 per cent and 5 per cent of the 191,986 DES participants achieved a 13 week and 26 week outcome respectively in that period. The table below shows the break down for the most prevalent disabilities.

It is important to note that many people who participated in the first 4 months of 2015-16 will get 13 and 26 week outcomes after 31 October 2015 that are not counted in the outcome figures shown below as these figures only include outcomes achieved in the four months from 1 July to 31 October 2015.
