Question:

Noting that, generally, a patient is referred to a surgeon and has little, if any understanding in relation to charging practices, has the Department considered requiring disclosure such that patients are better informed of their choices and of surgeons' and medical proceduralists' charging practices? Would this approach result in a more even playing field in terms of price negotiations between surgeons and medical proceduralists and patients?

Answer:

Doctors are obliged to fully explain their fees and any applicable Medicare Benefits Schedule and private health insurance rebates to their patients. This is known as 'informed financial consent' and is set out in the Medical Board of Australia's (MBA) code of conduct for doctors.
