Topic: Taxi costs

Senator Ludwig, Joe asked:

Since the change of Prime Minister on 14 September 2015:

- 1. How much did each department/agency spend on taxis during the specified period? Provide a breakdown for each business group in each department/agency.
- 2. What are the reasons for taxi costs?
- 3. How much did the department spend on taxis during the specified period for their minister or minister's office?

Answer:

1. The ABC does not separately track expenditure incurred specifically on taxis (only) nor is it feasible to determine these costs specifically from 14 September 2015, so information has been provided for the period 1 September 2015 to 31 January 2016 and may include some amounts (albeit small) not incurred specifically on taxis.

Expenditure on taxis (and related spend) over this period amounted to approximately \$1,050,371.
