In terms of the Board, there is not a "register" of conflict per se but instead the Board members are required to submit standing notices of material interest held by the member to the Board at the commencement of the member's term and to update those standing notices to reflect any changes in interests held (including any new interests). Conflicts of interest are included as an agenda item at each Board meeting to enable Board members to declare any conflict of interest that may arise as a result of matters to be dealt with by the Board.  When a conflict of interest is declared by a Board member the conflict is dealt with in accordance with the procedure of the relevant specific provisions of the <i>Public Governance and Accountability Act 2013</i> and of Chapter 2, Part 2-2 Division 2 of the Public Governance and Accountability Rule 2014. Related party transactions are approved by the Board only after consideration by the Audit and Risk Committee.  In terms of the Board's supervision of the CEO and employees, any conflicts of interest held by staff must be declared and are recorded in a managed register which is regularly reviewed by the Board's Audit & Risk Committee.
