## Senator Whish-Wilson asked:

**Senator WHISH-WILSON:** Can you tell us how much of the \$3 million has now been used and, if possible, how much of it has been allocated to raking versus stabilisation versus stormwater versus revegetation?

**Mr Costello:** I may have to take the details of the breakdown on notice, if that is okay.

## Answer:

As of 30 June 2015, of the \$3 million approved, \$1 million has been paid to Launceston City Council. In addition, the Council contributed \$810,648 for the 2014 – 15 financial year.

The 2014 – 15 expenditure of the total \$1,810,648 comprised:

- \$584,832 for sediment management
- \$915,940 for riverbank stabilisation
- \$164,714 for stormwater/sewer outlet rationalisation
- \$100,000 for riparian protection and restoration
- \$45,162 for monitoring and evaluation.
