Senator O'Sullivan asked:

Senator O'SULLIVAN: That will no doubt be reflected in the file notes that you have taken. Did you make file notes during the discussions about the matters of these permits?

Mr Gaddes: I am not sure if there were file notes. I had officials follow up for me at a later date to ask for the information. We followed up in correspondence requesting the information that was discussed.

Senator CANAVAN: Mr Gaddes, you mentioned that you met with the Queensland government in or around June. Why did it take you six months to write this letter?
