**Topic: Legal Costs**

**Senator Senator Ludwig asked:**

Since Budget Estimates in June, 2014:

1. List all legal costs incurred by the department or agency
2. List the total cost for these items, broken down by source of legal advice, hours retained or taken to prepare the advice and the level of counsel used in preparing the advice, whether the advice was internal or external
3. List cost spend briefing Counsel, broken down by hours spent briefing, whether it was direct or indirect briefing, the gender ratio of Counsel, how each Counsel was engaged (departmental, ministerial)
4. How was each piece of advice procured? Detail the method of identifying legal advice.

**Answer:**

The agency expenditure on legal services for the period 1 June 2014 to 31 October 2014, including internal legal costs, was \$1,928,122. The legal services provided covered the full range of legal matters requiring consideration by the agency, including legal interpretation, drafting of documentation and instruments (including legislative instruments), management of litigation, review of investigation reports and Authority papers, and all other necessary forms of legal advice and assistance.

The agency expenditure on legal services for the same period from the Australian Government Solicitor was \$193,638, for a range of litigation matters and other miscellaneous advice and assistance. This figure includes disbursements to counsel.

The agency expenditure on legal services for the same period from Office of Parliamentary Counsel was \$49,173, for drafting advice and assistance.

The agency expenditure on legal services for the same period from private firms was \$18,769, for legal advice and assistance.

The agency expenditure on senior and junior counsel for the same period was \$43,267, for legal advice and representation.

Records of "hours retained or taken to prepare the advice" are not kept with respect to internal legal advice and it would be an unreasonable diversion of resources to construct such records retrospectively.

2. The agency expenditure on disbursements to senior and junior counsel briefed for the same period was \$43,267 for litigation services and for miscellaneous advice and assistance. All briefs were indirect. The gender split for this expenditure was 13% female to 87% male.
3. External advice was procured in the manner required by the *Legal Services Directions 2005*. The need for external legal advice is identified by senior lawyers working within the ACMA's Legal Services Division acting upon the instructions of the Authority and the senior line area managers employed by the Authority.
