Existing arrangements for the residencies being discontinued will be delivered until their conclusion in 2016. The Australia Council does not own any of the properties involved in the international residencies which are being discontinued.

For residencies where the Australia Council does not own the property, delivery is through partnerships with international residency providers who manage their own properties, or the Australia Council engages in a lease for the property, which is run by a studio manager.

The International Residencies Program is distinct from the Artists in Residence program. Please refer to response to QoN 45 for more information.

^{*}These three residencies are referred to as "owned" because they are identified on the Australia Council's balance sheet as an asset. This includes the BR Whiting Library in Rome which is owned by the Council, and the two studios at the Cité International des Arts in Paris which are on a long lease hold until 2060. Please refer to response to QoN 58 for more information.

^{**}New York remains a priority market and the Council will be replacing the two New York residencies.
