Answer:

- 1. The next steps are outlined in the Action Plan against each of the targets.
- 2. The hard and measurable targets are detailed in the Action Plan of Threatened Species Strategy on pages on pages 46 59 which is available at http://www.environment.gov.au/biodiversity/threatened/publications/threatened-species-strategy.
- 3. The Threatened Species Strategy is clear that we all have a role to play in threatened species recovery. Its implementation and resourcing will be a collective national effort delivered by the Australian Government, state and territory governments, and the non-government and private sectors. At the Threatened Species Summit in July this year, projects worth \$6.6 million were announced to help deliver the targets the Strategy, which brings the total to more than \$111 million since July 2014 that has been committed to projects in support of threatened species.
