Among others, these include feral cats, foxes, fire, habitat degradation, habitat fragmentation, feral pigs, goats, rats, rabbits, multiple invasive insects, chytrid fungus, eroision, invasive weeds, invasive birds, cane toads, myrtle rust, climate change and toxoplasmosis.
