Senator BUSHBY asked:

- 848. What sum did each portfolio department and agency spend on legal services for this financial year to date within the department/agency? Please provide a list of each service and costs.
- 849. What sum did each portfolio department and agency spend on legal services this financial year to date from the Australian Government Solicitor? Please provide a list of each service and costs.
- What sum did each portfolio department and agency spend on legal services this financial year to date from private firms? Please provide a list of each service and costs.
- What sum did each portfolio department and agency spend on legal services this financial year to date from other sources? Please provide a list of each service and costs.

Answer:

- 848. The expenditure on legal services within the ACCC for the period from 1 July 2012 to 31 May 2013 was \$7,982,582. This is comprised of staffing and associated costs for the Legal Group.
- 849. The ACCC's expenditure on legal services from the Australian Government Solicitor for the period from 1 July 2012 to 31 May 2013 was \$15,257,388. This is comprised of expenditure on Professional Service Fees in the amount of \$10,993,299 and Legal Counsel Fees of \$4,264,089.
- 850. The ACCC's expenditure on legal services from private firms for the period 1 July 2012 to 31 May 2013 was \$7,729,832. This is comprised of expenditure on Professional Service Fees in the amount of \$5,635,518, and Legal Counsel Fees of \$2,094,314.
- 851. The ACCC's expenditure on legal services from other sources for the period 1 July 2012 to 31 May 2013 was \$101,792. This is comprised of expenditure on Direct Briefed Counsel Fees in the amount of \$98,230 and Legal Services from the Office of Parliamentary Counsel in the amount of \$3,562.
