Question:

Since Budget Estimates in June, 2014:

- 2046. How much did each department/agency spend on taxis during the specified period?
 - a. Provide a breakdown for each business group in each department/agency.
 - b. What are the reasons for taxi costs?
- 2047. How much did the department spend on taxis during the specified period for their minister or minister's office?

Answer:

2046. From 1 June to 31 October 2014, the ATO (including the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission, Australian Valuation Office, Australian Business Register and Tax Practitioners Board) spent \$1,478,831 (GST exclusive) on taxis.
