Dear Senator Dastyari,

I write following the Economics Legislation Committee's Estimate's hearing today where the Commissioner of Taxation Mr Chris Jordan was questioned.

During the hearing, in response to a question from you, and one from Senator Leyonhjelm, Mr Jordan stated that the Australian Taxation Office consulted with the Australian Hotels Association (AHA) and other industry bodies about its sharing economy guidance note.

We believe this to be incorrect, based on the evidence at hand, and believe the Commissioner may have misled the Committee.

Uber made a Freedom Of Information application on 12 August 2015, (attached) requesting the following;

"documents relating to the ATO's guidance not about the sharing economy that relate to any consultation the ATO undertook with industry bodies or industry representatives including, but not limited to, the Australian Hotels Association, Tourism Accommodation Australia, The Accommodation Association of Australia, Tourism and Transport Forum. All documents including but not limited to emails briefing notes, written correspondence."

The timeframe for this request was 1/1/2014 to 12/08/2015.

UBER

The Freedom of Information request did not result in any documents being provided to

Uber that indicated that the ATO consulted with any industry bodies other than the

Australian Taxi Industry Association.

Given that the Commissioner of Taxation specifically advised the Senate Committee

today that consultation did occur with the Australian Hotels Association, and they were

afforded the same consultation as the ATIA, we are concerned that either the

Committee was mislead by Mr Jordan, or documents were concealed and not provided

that should have been.

The Commissioner also tried to portray that the ATIA were consulted just as a normal

course of events, as was the hotel industry. However, Freedom of Information requests

released on 9 October show that the ATO considered the ATIA to be a 'Primary

Stakeholder' along with EY and States & Territories, while other sharing economy

participants were 'minor stakeholders'. No mention was made of any other industry

group including Uber.

I have attached the supporting evidence of our concerns. If the Commissioner has

mislead the Committee I trust that you will take appropriate steps to have the record

corrected immediately and ask the Committee and the Senate to consider appropriate

action.
