## **Question:**

Regarding the Australian Law Reform Commission's report Copyright and Digital Economy: a. What contribution did the Productivity Commission or the Treasury make to this inquiry? Please provide a detailed account of any input.

b. What contribution did the Productivity Commission or the Treasury make to the subsequent Ernst & Young cost benefit analysis? Please provide a detailed account of any input.

### **Answer:**

- (a) The Commission did not contribute to the Australian Law Reform's Commission report on Copyright and the Digital Economy. The Commission notes however, that the report did cite a speech made by the Commission's chair, Mr Peter Harris (see for example para 3.150).
- (b) The Commission was a user of, rather than a contributor to, the Ernst & Young cost benefit report. The Commission drew on the report in forming a final position on potential copyright reforms.
