AIATSIS - Years to complete the digitisation of the Institute's existing non-digital materials

Question

If funding were to continue at the level provided in 2014 15, how many years would it take to complete the digitisation of the Institute's existing non-digital materials?

Answer

AIATSIS has provided the following response.

The table provides the size of the Australian Institute of Aboriginal and Torres Strait islander Studies (AIATSIS) current collection across different media, the amount and percentage of each that has been digitised as at April 2015, the rate at which digitisation can occur as per 2014-15 resources, and our best estimates of the time to complete digitisation of the existing collection, based on available information and current resources.

Please note:

- the units of measurement for each medium are different
- AIATSIS' collections across all media are growing, and this growth includes significant and fragile materials
- further process (such as archiving, describing, cataloguing) may still be required before digital copies of material can be accessed by researchers and/or communities
- digitised material is not and will not necessarily be made available online
- digitised material requires regular migration to updated formats to ensure its preservation and accessibility in the long term
- projections to complete digitisation of the manuscript collection have not been made, as it
 is not of the same level of priority as other media.

On 29 April 2015, the Minister for Education, the Hon Christopher Pyne MP, announced that \$5 million in funding is being provided to AIATSIS in 2015-16 to strengthen the capacity of the AIATSIS to manage and preserve its collection. This replaces the \$3.3 million that was provided for the digitisation program in 2014-15.
