Breakdown of the percentage of families accessing different service types

Question

Can the Department provide a breakdown of the percentage of families accessing different service types (long day care, family day care, outside schools hours care) based on their annual income? Can the department provide this information broken down by the proposed child care subsidy income threshold(s) i.e.:

- a. Low income families (under \$65,710)
- b. low-middle income (\$65,710 \$170,710)
- c. Upper Income (\$170,710 \$250,000)
- d. High Income (above \$250,000)

Answer

The table below shows the proportion of families in each of the income brackets by child care service type.
