# Sydney University – introduction of fourth year in undergraduate programs

### Question

The University of Sydney has flagged the introduction of a fourth year for undergraduate students designed to give deliver "work-ready" skills. This would be separate from the research-oriented honours year. Has the University approached the department about this, with regard to funding this extra year? What has been the outcome?

#### **Answer**

The University of Sydney has discussed its curriculum and course structure changes with officers from the Department of Education and Training.

Within the parameters of the *Higher Education Support Act 2003* (HESA), universities, as autonomous institutions, are best placed to determine their appropriate course structures.

Under HESA, the grant amount the Commonwealth provides for non-designated courses of study as a Table A provider is determined under section 33-5(5). Funding for the extra year of the university's new course structure will be provided in accordance with HESA.
