### QUESTION ON NOTICE Budget Estimates 2017 - 2018

#### Outcome: Schools and Youth

#### Department of Education and Training Question No. SQ17-000755

Senator Collins, Jacinta provided in writing

#### *Schools funding – additional funding by state over 2018 to 2027*

##### Question

Of the \$18.6 billion schools funding package announced how much will each state receive of this \$18.6 billion in dollars, and how much will they receive year by year 2018 to 2027.

##### Answer

The 2017–18 Budget provided an additional \$18.6 billion in Commonwealth recurrent funding for schools from 2018 to 2017. This amount has been updated following passage of the Australian Education Amendment Bill 2017. An additional \$23.4 billion in Commonwealth recurrent funding will now be provided from 2018 to 2027, compared to the 2016–17 Budget. The following table details how this funding will be distributed between states and territories.

Note: state and territory allocations in the 2016–17 Budget from the 2018 school year onwards were indicative only and subject to consultation between the Commonwealth, the states and territories, and the non-government sector.
