Question

Senator KIM CARR: In terms of the Commonwealth Grant Scheme moneys, in the previous estimates I sort information regarding STEM students operating in the department. You basically said that there were 15 programs operating in the department, particularly for summer schools and the like. There seems to be that only one continues beyond 2016—is that correct?

Ms Paul: You are referring to a question on notice?

Senator KIM CARR: Yes—SQ15000390 and 380.

Ms Paul: It crosses the questions cross schools and higher education and vocational educational etcetera. If we have not given you end dates, we probably have to retake it on notice and give you end dates.

Senator KIM CARR: Well, put that on notice.

Answer

The current schools and higher education programmes operating within the department that deal with science, technology, engineering and/or mathematics (STEM) were listed in SQ15-000390.

The following programmes currently have funding allocations that continue beyond 2016. A number of projects within the programmes will continue beyond the funding end date.
