Review of ACARA

Question

Senator O'NEILL: So there were some adjustments to the recommendations, based on feedback from the states and territories.

Mr Cook: I think there were some minor slight adjustments made when they went out to state and territory departments for consultation.

Senator O'NEILL: When you say minor slight ones, for example:

C2: ACARA undertakes a six-year cycle of review for the Australian Curriculum.

What would be a slight adjustment?

Mr Cook: I do not think that there was an adjustment to that one that I am aware of. But I will have to take it on notice. I do not have the details with me at the moment about what state and territories have indicated.

Senator O'NEILL: If you could indicate any ones that required an adjustment after the first round.

Mr Cook: Sure. As I said, that would be very few. For those that did, it was just some slight change of wording, is my understanding.

Answer

As detailed in the following table, there were minor changes made to five recommendations relating to the assessment and governance themes of the Review of the Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA).
