## Audit of a provider

#### Question

What are the triggers for the Department to conduct an audit of a provider?

#### **Answer**

A combination of triggers assist the Department of Education and Training in its risk based approach to compliance in order to identify providers requiring compliance action:

- requests for large increases to VET FEE-HELP advances
- · anomalies in submitted data
- rapid growth in enrolments
- compliance with the *Higher Education Support Act* and the VET FEE-HELP Guidelines
- financial viability concerns
- intelligence and information received from the Australian Skills Quality Authority, Australian Competition and Consumer Commission and state consumer protection agencies
- complaints received from consumers, the public, other providers and other government agencies
- · adverse media reporting.

A VET FEE-HELP compliance strategy was developed in 2014 and further enhanced in 2015.

In the 2015-16 budget the department received \$18.2 million to help support compliance activities including more random audits.
