## Child Care Rebate cap

### Question

In relation to the CCR cap:

- a. How many families and children are projected to hit the \$7,500 CCR cap in the current year and future years? How many of these families also receive CCB in full or in part? b. How many families and children have hit the \$7,500 CCR cap in each of the last five years?
- c. How many families that are projected to hit the current CCR cap have an income of more than \$185,000 per annum? How many have an income of more than \$165,000? How many have an income of more than \$230,000?

#### Answer

- a. It is estimated that 84,400 families and 96,000 children will reach the CCR cap in 2015-16, and that 107,800 families and 123,400 children will reach the CCR cap in 2016-17. To provide an answer on how many families also receive CCB would require an unreasonable diversion of resources.
- b. Table 1 contains the number of families and children that have hit the CCR cap in the past 5 years.
