- e) The cost of official photography to the Department of Prime Minister and Cabinet from 1 July 2010 to 21 February 2011 was \$81,268 (GST inclusive). This figure includes costs for the Arts and Sports Group from 1 November 2011.
- f) The services were requested by the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet.
- g) Of the 5094 images, 4439 were provided by Auspic of the Department of the Finance and Deregulation.
- h) As has been the practice of successive governments, Auspic, as the official government photographic service, has travelled with the Prime Minister on most official visits, and accompanied Heads of State, Heads of Government and Royalty on official visits to Australia.
