Answer:

The pilot phase of the Efficiency through Contestability Programme (Contestability Programme) commenced in late-2014 and is expected to be completed shortly.

The pilot phase is being utilised to trial the Contestability Programme's methodology, operation and related guidance before being rolled out across government.

A number of entities have been involved in the development and implementation of the Contestability Programme including the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet and the Department of the Treasury providing input in the design of the Contestability Programme. The following entities have been involved in:

- Pilot Portfolio Stocktakes the Finance and Communications Portfolios;
- Contestability Reviews a number of entities have been involved in specific Contestability Reviews, that are currently being considered by Government; and
- Functional and Efficiency Reviews the Departments of Education and Training; and Health.
