**Question:**

I refer you to question F85 asked from Supplementary Estimates in 2014. The Commonwealth Superannuation Corporation said that they spent \$12,279.91 on "Security Awareness Training" by the AFP.

Could you please provide the following information with regard to this training:

1. What topics were covered during this training?
2. How many people attended this training and what were their job titles?
3. What is the justification for this training?
4. Were there any security breaches that provided the need for this training? If yes, please detail the incident. Please include: The date of the breach; the nature of the breach; have any reviews or reports been commissioned to study the breach; was anyone disciplined as a result of the breach?

**Answer:**

1. The training covered physical, information and personnel security awareness in the context of the Commonwealth Protective Security Policy Framework.
2. 78 staff across all teams and all levels of CSC attended the training.
3. CSC considers it good business practice for its staff to be aware of security risks for their own safety and as CSC's first line of defence against security risks. Also, from 1 July 2015 it is expected that corporate Commonwealth entities such as CSC will need to comply with a Government Policy Order in relation to the Commonwealth Protective Security Policy Framework.
