Question:

Senator DODSON: Are you still committed to the Social Security Legislation Amendment (Community Development Program) Bill 2015?

Senator Scullion: Broadly, we are. As you would be aware, this is a matter of negotiation through government and across parliament to ensure that we land on the right space. Yes, we certainly are committed to the improvements that that process can bring.

Senator DODSON: Can you provide an outline of what further consultations have taken place since the introduction of the bill?

Ms Williams: There was quite significant consultation as part of the introduction of the bill and following the introduction of the bill. Over the last couple of months, we have continued to undertake discussions, particularly with current CDP providers and those Aboriginal organisations that have a particular interest in being involved in the design and the delivery of any new model.

Senator DODSON: Is it possible to get a list of those consulted post lodgement of the bill? Ms Williams: Yes, certainly. I can provide you with that.

Senator DODSON: Minister, can you outline any proposed changes that may be contemplated in the bill; that is, changes to what you have actually got? Senator Scullion: Yes. I just want to be absolutely sure that I am talking about the same

legislation. I will check on that.

Answer:

Since the introduction of the Social Security Legislation Amendment (Community Development Programme) Bill in late 2015, both the Minister for Indigenous Affairs, Senator the Hon Nigel Scullion, and the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet (PM&C) have undertaken further consultation with a range of stakeholders. PM&C has released detailed information and has held discussions through meetings, forums and a public consultation process including in a number of remote communities.

The Minister for Indigenous Affairs, Senator the Hon Nigel Scullion, continues to consult with members of the Opposition on reforms to the Community Development Programme.
