#### **Question:**

**Senator CONROY:** In Mr Costello's capacity as executive general manager at ASC, did he have access to information that could be considered sensitive in either a commercial or a national security sense?

**Mr Whiley:** I am unsure what information—

**Senator Cormann:** We will take that question on notice.

**Senator CONROY:** You must know what information—he is head of strategy—

**Senator Cormann:** We have taken the question on notice.

**Senator CONROY:** What information is an executive manager at ASC privy to?

**Senator Cormann:** That is a different way of asking the same question, and I have already taken that question on notice.

**Senator CONROY:** Would an executive general manager be privy to information concerning ASC's intellectual property—commercially sensitive information, confidential or operational information, information relating to its internal governance structures and decision making processes?

**Senator Cormann:** That is another way of asking the same question, and I have already taken that question on notice.

#### **Answer:**

Mr Costello did have access to such information. Established rules and systems for managing the use of this information were in place.
