Senator WONG: Okay. In the same article Mr Shanahan says that the Prime Minister refused to accept the resignation of his chief of staff. As the Minister representing the Prime Minister, could you indicate to the committee when Ms Credlin offered her resignation and why the Prime Minister refused to accept it.

Senator Cormann: I am not aware of the circumstances of that you refer to. Indeed, I am not aware of whether there has been an offer of resignation, so I would have to take any questions in relation to these matters on notice.
