**Question:** 

**Senator GALLAGHER:** Will the government be releasing the functional and efficiency reviews, including those where the savings have been factored into the forward estimates? **Senator Cormann:** The functional and efficiency reviews?

Senator GALLAGHER: Yes.

**Senator Cormann:** They are part of the deliberative cabinet process, and, consistent with the approach of all governments, we do not release deliberative cabinet documents.

**Senator GALLAGHER:** Is there a way that you could identify that \$5 billion in savings without releasing the functional and efficiency review? What constitutes that figure? **Senator Cormann:** I will take that on notice, and we will see what we can do.

## Answer:

The outcomes of the Functional and Efficiency Review have achieved gross savings of around \$5 billion from 2014-15 to 2020-21 through streamlining programs, improving span of control, system and compliance processes, and terminating legacy programs. A breakdown by Functional and Efficiency Review is provided below:
