# **Question:**

The National Congress of Australia's First Peoples received \$15 million in the 2013-14 Budget, allocated from 2014-15 to 2016-17 to enable Congress to continue operating as a national representative body, informing government on the views, issues and concerns of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and providing input into the development of policies and programs.

- (a) How will the Government ensure the future sustainability of Congress?
- (b) Is the government committed to the funding provided to Congress in the 2013-14 budget?
- (c) Can we expect to see the continuation of the funding over the full three years?
- (d) If not, what is the rationale behind ripping this funding away from Congress?
- (e) How does the Minister reconcile the Government's rhetoric of a new engagement with Indigenous people with a decision not to honour funding commitments to support Congress a national representative body for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples?

#### **Answer:**

Future sustainability is a matter for the Congress and funding for Congress is a matter for Government.
