An Agreement made between the Presiding Officers of the Commonwealth Parliament and the Minister responsible for the Ministerial Wing regarding certain aspects of the management of the Ministerial Wing of the new Parliament House

Under sub-section 6(1) of the <u>Parliamentary Precincts Act 1988</u>, the parliamentary precincts as defined by that Act are under the control and management of the Presiding Officers.

Under sub-section 6(3) of the Act the Presiding Officers and the Minister may agree to conditions for the control and management of the Ministerial Wing of the Parliament House. The agreement is set out below.

In addition to this agreement, provision is made at paragraph 3.2 for more detailed arrangements to be agreed between the Presiding Officers and the Minister or between appropriate officers with respect to the management, provision of services and building operations in the Ministerial Wing.

It is agreed as follows:

1. This Agreement applies exclusively to that area of Parliament House known as the Ministerial Wing. The area is defined in the Schedule to this Agreement.

2. Security

- 2.1 The security arrangements and policies to apply within the Ministerial Wing shall be consistent with those determined by the Presiding Officers to apply to Parliament House and the parliamentary precincts as a whole.
- 2.2 By agreement with the Presiding Officers, any policy relating to additional security requirements for the Ministerial Wing may be determined by the Minister and shall be implemented by the Australian Protective Service.
- 2.3 In accordance with an Arrangement entered into under section 9 of the <u>Parliamentary Precincts Act 1988</u> between the Presiding Officers and the Minister administering the <u>Australian Protective Service Act 1987</u>, personnel of the

Australian Protective Service shall be deployed on securiduties within the Ministerial Wing. These duties shall be agreed by the Presiding Officers and the Minister.

- 2.4 The rules of access and control of entry to the Ministerial Wing shall be the same as those in force for all other areas of Parliament House.
- 2.5 The rules of access and control of the Ministerial Win underground carpark shall be determined by the Minister.
- 2.6 The response to, and management of, emergencies within the Ministerial Wing, such as fire, threats of explosive devices, toxic fumes etc. shall be in accordance with arrangements and procedures determined by the Presiding Officers.

3. Other Services

- 3.1 The Presiding Officers agree to provide the following services to the Ministerial Wing.
 - . Capital (New) Works
 - . Building Operations and Maintenance Services
 - . Catering Services
 - Housekeeping Services (including cleaning, goods distribution, pot plants, amenities and recreational services)
 - . Artworks and Curatorial Services
 - Information Systems Services including sound and vision and telecommunication services
 - . Use of Parliamentary Committee Rooms
 - . Mail delivery and Clerical Assistance services
 - . Certain services provided by the Department of the Parliamentary Reporting Staff
 - . Certain services provided by the Department of the Parliamentary Library
 - such other services as may be agreed to from time to time.
- 3.2 The detailed arrangements for the provision of these services will be set out in separate documentation exchanged between the relevant Departments at appropriate officer level.
- 3.3 Where applicable, charges will be levied for the provision of these services. The costs shall be met by the Department of Administrative Services or other relevant Portfolio Department, whichever is the recipient of the service and shall be payable to the Parliamentary Department which provided the service.
- 3.4 Resolution of any disagreement of interpretation of any documentation exchanged pursuant to paragraph 3.2 above shall be by the process for resolution of disagreement for this Agreement, set out at paragraph 5 below.

- 4. This Agreement may be varied from time to time by further agreement.
- 5. Any disagreement in relation to interpretation of the Agreement shall be resolved by the Presiding Officers a consultation with the Minister.
