The answer to the honourable senator's question is as follows:

The Commission has a longstanding practice of publishing a selection of speeches delivered by its President or Commissioners. This is primarily a resourcing issue, as the Commission does not consider the resources required to check against delivery or convert talking points into a written speech for publication is warranted in all circumstances, and as some speeches repeat information contained in other published speeches.
