Senator Singh (L&CA 14) asked:

Senator SINGH: What did those reports actually recommend?

Lt Gen. Campbell: Those reports, in their current form, are classified, but we can take it on notice, as the secretary indicated, to look into providing some redacted form of them.

The purpose of the report was to look to the security arrangements and whether there were opportunities to make recommendations on improvements to security settings on Manus in all its forms. You can understand why, therefore, there is a desire for at least some of that information to be classified—because it would speak to what might have been at that time existing or, in some cases, continuing potential weaknesses in security that are being looked to being addressed, with some having been dealt with and some continuing to be dealt with.

Senator SINGH: Right. We will wait for the answer on notice.

Answer:

The Joint Agency Task Force force protection review and subsequent progress reports are classified for security reasons.

To assist the Committee, attached is an unclassified version of the Manus Offshore Processing Centre October 2013 review that includes a summary of recommendations and their progress as at 16 February 2014 and 23 June 2014.
