Senator Singh (L&CA 99) asked:

Senator SINGH: While they are here, how many apply for asylum? That was the figure that I was going on, the larger figure.

Dr Southern: Yes, that is a much larger figure of people who have claimed asylum. Senator SINGH: You do not have an answer to that question? We have the answer, obviously, to 14 March.

Dr Southern: No, I do not have updated figures for that to bring it up to date. We could take that on notice if you like wanted an update.

Answer:

During the period 7 September 2013 to 31 May 2014, 2 578 applications were made for protection by those who arrived on visitor/tourist visas (see the table below for a breakdown by subclass). Of these applications, six have been successful, 117 have been unsuccessful, 147 have been withdrawn or were found to be invalid at primary assessment and 2 308 are still in process.
