BUDGET ESTIMATES – 26 – 27 MAY 2014

IMMIGRATION AND BORDER PROTECTION PORTFOLIO

(BE14/204) PROGRAMME – Australian Customs and Border Protection Service

Senator Carr (Written) asked:

Senator Cash announced that Australia's Next Generation Automated eGates were undergoing testing and would be rolled out for a live trial at Brisbane Airport from July 2014.

- a. Provide a breakdown in costs for this project.
- b. Who is developing the eGates for ACBPS?
- c. Was there a tender process for the rollout of eGates?
- d. If not, why?
- e. What was the cost of the contract?

What is the planned roll out of the new eGates (i.e. what airports will get the new gates next and when)?

Answer:

- a. The project will be delivered over two years at a cost of \$8.4 million. The Australian Customs and Border Protection Service and the Department of Immigration and Border Protection will absorb \$7 million and \$1.4 million respectively.
- b. Two eGates, one supplied by Morpho and one supplied by IBM/VisionBox are being trialed in a competitive process.
- c. A tender process was used to establish a panel of technology providers for automated border processing and biometric technologies. The panel was established in November 2013. A request for quote was issued to this panel to acquire the technology currently in trial.
- d. Not applicable.
- e. Total cost of the contracts involved to date is \$1,840,223.
- f. The eGate trial will be conducted at Brisbane International Airport. The trial commences 1 July 2014 and is scheduled to run for a year.
