## Senator Collins asked the following question at the hearing on 20 October 2015:

- 1. Nepal has recently closed it borders to Australians seeking commercial surrogacy services in that country. Can you provide the number of babies born through surrogacy arrangements commissioned by Australian parents that are still in Nepal?
- 2. Can you provide the number of babies born through commercial surrogacy arrangements and commissioned by Australian parents that have been born overseas this year?
- 3. When will the Attorney-General respond to the House of Representatives Standing Committee on Social Policy and Legal Affairs Roundtable on Surrogacy report tabled on 24 March 2015?
- 4. Will the Attorney-General commit to implementing the one recommendation contained in that report, to refer to the House of Representatives Standing Committee on Social Policy and Legal Affairs an inquiry into the regulatory and legislative aspects of surrogacy arrangements with a focus on both domestic surrogacy arrangements and international surrogacy arrangements involving Australian nationals?
